2021 was a challenging year. This year, we are pushing forward to reform our organization to a larger scale as a food bank. We keep moving to collect surplus food from various supply chains and enhance the capacity and coverage of the beneficiaries in Medan.

In the second wave of Covid-19, we reached a growth of food donation volume of around 32 tons. But, we need to contribute more as our commitment to food sovereignty. The scale and intensity of this demand keep pushing us forward as a food bank to maximize our food storage, processing, and distribution.

Our network will contribute to and enhance to establish the ecosystem of redistributing surplus food in Medan. Until this period, we have reached more than 1,400 people from the Frontline Organization (FLO) and 19,000 people from various social communities in Medan.

We appreciate the enhancement of food loss and waste issues and environmental damage. Our thanks go out to volunteers, donors, delivery partners, food providers, local farmers, retailers, bakeries, and the public.

Your support will keep our dedication with our best efforts to establish the sustainable food system in Medan.

Background

14.3% of Indonesians live below the line poverty, especially in rural areas. Factor poverty affects inequality of access to food. As a result, 19.4 million people are not able to meet their food needs (World Food programs). Indonesia is ranked 71 out of 107 countries in the Global Hunger Index (GHI). The result of the Medan City Food Security Index in 2019 showed a score of 80.91% which reflects resilience to good food but, on the other hand, indicates 19.09% of the people of Medan are in food insecurity. Based on the Central Bureau of Statistics of North Sumatra, there is 8.01% of the poor live in Medan City. In 2015, FLW issue became part of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) contained in target 12.3, stating, "By 2030, halve per capita global food waste at the retail and consumer levels and reduce food losses along production and supply chains, including post-harvest losses. According to the data of the Ministry of Environment and Forestry (MoEF) of the Republic of Indonesia, in 2018, as much as 44% of waste generation in Indonesia was food waste

Aksata Pangan (formerly known as the Food Truck Sedekah) is dedicated to tackling hunger and food waste in Indonesia, particularly in Medan. Our surplus food is delivered through regular programs such as Food Stamps, Food Heroes, and Food Pantry. According to 2021 Aksata Pangan's report, we provide food to 21,069 needy people in Medan, around 100,000 portions of cooked foods that total weigh almost 50 tons as well as saved 68,76 tons Co2e from potential food waste.

For almost 5 years operated, Aksata Pangan has collaborated with food companies for instance Nestle Indonesia, Nutrifood, Sunpride, distributors, retail, food and beverage businesses, and hospitality industries in handling their surplus products. In addition, we serve needy people in 16 sub-districts in Medan and 24 Frontline Organizations (FLO) which are from orphanages, foundations, and communities regularly. Our targetted beneficiaries are vulnerable groups such as children, low-income families, the aspiring middle class, the elderly, and disabilities.



In terms of credibility, Aksata Pangan has been a part of the New Food Bank Development Program from the Global Foodbanking Network (GFN) in Chicago, The United States. GFN works to support Food Banking in more than fifty countries and have assisted with funding and technical assistance. Furthermore, we joined Gotong Royong Atasi Susut & Limbah Pangan (GRASP) 2030 as a voluntary commitment to handling Food Loss and Waste (FLW) in Indonesia as Associates Signatories.

In 2022, Aksata Pangan has grants from the Southeast Asian Leaders Initiative (YSEALI) Seeds for the Future from the U.S. Department of State, U.S. Mission to ASEAN, and Cultural Vistas. We succeed in saving more than 858,78 pounds of bread surplus from 5 bakeries in Medan, distributed to Frontline Organization (FLO) and a local maggot farmer saved 1,976 CO2 ek from bread waste.



About Us

Taken from the word 'Aksata' in Sanskrit which means 'unbroken', Aksata Pangan is a non-profit organization that focuses on overcoming food issues in the community by adapting food system approaches. Aksata Pangan operates as a food bank, which is to become the center of food coordination obtained from various sources to processing, storing, and distributing to the public around Medan City.

Legal

Aksata Pangan has been legally registered under the name of Yayasan Aksata Pangan Indonesia on 25th June 2021 according to the Resolution of the Republic of Indonesia Minister of Law and Human Rights number AHU-0015457.AH.01.04. 2021 about the Ratification of Legal Entity Yayasan Aksata Pangan indonesia.

Methods

In short, a food bank works like a general food distributor, distributing food to a certain point. The Global FoodBanking Network (GFN) defines three general food bank models: the warehouse model, the prepared food recovery model, and the virtual food bank. We combine the two models which are the warehouse model and the prepared food recovery model. It will provide a warehouse for storing various types of non-perishable products and accepting donations in the form of ready-to-eat food or perishable foods for direct distribution. Therefore, we define the working principles at Food Aksata:



Food Distribution

Distributing food to help and trim the access gap to food.



Food Redistribution

Saving the potency of food resources that will be wasted and redistributing it




Food Preservation

Collecting and storing the surplus food from various sectors.



Scheme

To ensure the distribution, we directly distribute and or by our trusted FLO.

Aksata Pangan also supports the Sustainable Development Goals, or SDGs, through numerous projects launched, such as point 2 combating hunger, point 12 ensuring sustainable production and consumption habits, and point 13 combating climate change.



Zero Hunger
Efforts to distribute and redistribute surplus food to those who are food insecure and have difficulty accessing food.




Responsible Consumption and Production

Efforts to reduce food waste and loss that have an impact on greenhouse gas emissions.


Our Activity



Coverage


We commit to focusing on serving the Medan city area. In 2021, we have reached 14 districts.

Total Distribution




By direct distribution and FLO, we have distributed more than 100,000 portions of food and equal to 32 tons taken from various sources.

There are 21,069 people who get food assistance. The chart below illustrates the percentage of people in need who receive food assistance from direct distribution activities and through FLO.



Furthermore, the food waste management hierarchy provides steps dealing with food waste based on its environmental impact. It was explained that after the reduction of waste-producing sources, surplus food should be distributed to humans before being given to livestock. We have distributed more than 130 kg of donations in the form of food that can no longer be consumed to local farmers and our waste management partners



Salvaged CO2

Methodology

There are several limitations in determining the emission factors for each type of food based on the Life Cycle Assessment (LCA). This assessment does not include food purchased or produced to meet the needs of beneficiaries. Determination of the number of CO2 emissions using the approach below.

$$\text{CO2 emission} = \text{Redistributed surplus food (ton)} \times \text{emission factor}$$

Furthermore, we classify the types of products. Then proceed to perform calculations with the equation above. In assessing estimated CO2 emissions, we do not evaluate CO2 emissions resulting from our operations.

From a total of more than 30 tonnes of distributed surplus food, we managed to save 68.76 tonnes of CO2e which could potentially be generated from food waste.

What's next?

The Annual Report 2021 is not only about reviewing our past year's achievements but also identifying our weak points and projecting our demands in the next few years. Here we share our evaluation and learning in 2021.

Learning and Evaluation

1 Food Safety Risk

The most crucial consequence of the food bank model is ensuring food condition and safety. Drawing and establishing the standarization of food processing is our priority in the next step.

2 Food Distribution and Beneficiaries Coverage

Even though our results are good enough, we believe that many people are starving while we distribute food. It is our commitment to grow our coverage.

3 Food Bank Presence

We are aware of the presence of the food bank model not so familiar to some communities. We have not optimally pushed forward to the public about the food bank model in Medan. The understanding of the food bank model will be a call for collaboration between various sectors, mainly the local government and food producers.
